# 1. INTRODUCTION - GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

Join us for the 4<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Social and Health Sciences, where global experts, researchers, and professionals will gather to explore innovative solutions and strategies for building a future based on innovation, humanism and cooperation in today's divided world. **This one-day** event will be organized into three thematic sessions, each addressing crucial aspects of AI and business, healthcare and human well-being, as well as geopolitics, security, and regional and global cooperation in times of uncertainty.

## 2. OBJECTIVE OF THE CONFERENCE

Building on the themes introduced, the 4th International Conference on Social and Health Sciences seeks to deepen the conversation around future development in today's divided world by focusing on interdisciplinary approaches. The objective is to foster collaboration across fields such as AI, business, entrepreneurship, healthcare, law, international relations, governance, security, and media — emphasizing innovative solutions that can manage and even soften divisions in today's world. Through focused panel discussions, the conference will highlight actionable strategies and best practices that address today's challenges while creating long-term positive impacts for future generations.

## 3. TOPICS

The sessions will offer a focused exploration of innovation, human well-being, and regional and global cooperation in today's ever-changing world. Each panel will address critical issues and innovative solutions in AI, business transformation, healthcare, law, governance, and geopolitics. Special attention will be given to security, peace, and the role of South Eastern Europe and Kosovo in a divided international context.

### 3.1 Session 1: From Smart Tech to Green Impact: Rethinking Business and AI for Tomorrow

This session will explore the impact of smart technologies, particularly AI in environment, economy and leadership.

#### **Panel 1:** AI for Business Transformation and Ethical Leadership

Exploring how artificial intelligence reshapes industries, decision-making, and leadership while balancing ethics and regulation.

**Panel 2:** Green Entrepreneurship and Circular Economies

Business models that integrate sustainability, renewable energy, and circular economy practices to create long-term impact.

**Panel 3:** Digital Transformation and the Future of Work

Exploring automation, remote work, and digital skills required in a rapidly changing global labor market.

**3.2. Session 2: The Future of Health: AI and Human Well-Being**

This session will explore the actual and future relationship between advanced technologies and AI with health care and medicine.

**Panel 1:** AI in Diagnostics, Telemedicine, and Precision Care

Case studies and innovations in digital health, remote care, and personalized medicine.

**Panel 2:** Human-Centered Health Technologies

Balancing technological innovation with patient rights, ethics, and equity in healthcare access.

**Panel 3:** Mental Health, Lifestyle, and Digital Society

Addressing challenges of mental health, social media, and preventive health in an AI-driven world.

**3.3. Session 3: *Global Shifts: Geopolitics, Security, and Peace in Times of Uncertainty***

This session will explore actual geopolitical shifts and its impact on global and regional security and peace.

**Panel 1:** Tectonic Changes in Geopolitics: Conflicts, Trade Wars, and Global Security

Examining how armed conflicts, shifting alliances, and trade disputes reshape the international order.

**Panel 2:** South Eastern Europe and Kosovo in a Fragmented World

The role of the Balkans in European, US, Russia, China and global politics, EU integration, regional cooperation, and conflict resolution.

**Panel 3:** Media, Diplomacy, and Global Cooperation in the Age of Polarization

How narratives, soft power, and global institutions can foster peace and justice despite fragmentation.

Full submitted papers must be in English and should be between **5,000 and 10,000** words, including references with the title of the paper, authors' name/s, e-mail addresses, and affiliations. ## 7. REGISTRATION FEE

No fee is applicable for this conference.

## 8. SELECTION AND PAPER SUBMISSION – WEBSITE

### Types of Works

Different types of communications are admitted in the Conference: Papers, work in progress and posters.

- **“Paper”** is considered the original research work, having completed all its phases.
- **“Work in progress”** is considered the original work referred to as a medium or long-term research project. It is mandatory that the works have the following structure: objectives, methodological aspects, and foreseeable contributions of the study.
- **“Doctoral Thesis”** is considered the original research work, completed or not, in which the authors look for a different interaction with the participants of the Conference.
- **“Poster”** is considered the original research work, completed or not, in which the authors look for a different interaction with the participants of the Conference. The poster's purpose is to encourage a person-to-person discussion about the poster's research. The authors will interact with the participants by standing beside the posters on the assigned day and schedule.

## 9. REVIEW AND EVALUATION OF WORK ABSTRACT

- For each type of work submitted, authors must fill in the form “*Call for Paper - Registration*” that appears on the web page. All the identification data must be completed.
- After the submission of the abstract, the applicants will be notified by email with further guidelines about the presentation.
- The evaluation is structured by conference areas. The committee will decide the area where they want to evaluate their work, although the author may ask to be reassigned to a different area in order to optimize the work of the scientific committee.
- Once the evaluation is completed, the management system will contact the applicant and notify them in terms of their acceptance.

## 10. PUBLICATION IN THE CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

Once the abstracts have been accepted, the authors can decide whether the abstract or full papers will be published in the **Book of Conference Proceedings with ISBN**.

## 11. FULL PAPER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

After the presentation on the week of the conference, the participants can send the full paper by **May 26, 2026**

- The submission of the full paper will be done by email: [conference@universum-ks.org](mailto:conference@universum-ks.org)
- In the case of several works signed by more than one author, there must be a different effective registration for each of them. At least one different signatory per work must attend the Conference.
- In all cases, it is mandatory to use the template available here “Full Work Template”
- Failure to follow the rules implies rejection of the work presented.
- Full Paper is limited to **10 pages** normally, including all figures, tables, and references. No more pages will be allowed.

## 13. DOCUMENTATION TO BE SUBMITTED

- The files will be written in **Microsoft Word** format (version 2003 or higher). The images, tables, and figures must be inserted in the Word document in their corresponding place.

- Please save the paper with Name\_Lastname Type of Work (e.x. John\_Smith\_Doctoral Thesis; or Jane\_Smith\_Paper).

### 13. LANGUAGE AND WRITING LANGUAGE

Authors should submit their full papers in English

<b>Maximum extension:</b>	For papers and doctoral thesis: 10 A4 pages including text, tables, graphics, appendices, and bibliographical references (cover included). For work in progress: 5-10 A4 pages (cover included).
<b>Margins and line spacing:</b>	All margins of 2.50 cm. Single-line pacing. Source: Times New Roman.
<b>First page: Text:</b> <b>Titles of epigraphs:</b> <b>Sub-picture titles:</b>	According to the template.
<b>Summary:</b>	Must be in English. According to the template.
<b>Keywords:</b>	From 3 to 7 identifiers. According to the template.
<b>Headers:</b>	According to the template.  On an odd page: Job title (ellipses starting with the eighth word).
<b>Feet of page:</b>	Page numbering (Times New Roman, 9 points, bottom centered).
<b>Enumerations:</b>	Use of scripts only.  Indent of 0.50 cm. Left and French bleeding of 0.45 cm.
<b>Numbering of epigraphs:</b>	Include the number of the main heading followed by a period and the number of the sub-heading followed by a new point.
<b>Numbering of epigraphs:</b> <b>Tables (text or data) and Figures (graphics, diagrams or tables):</b>	According to the template.  First line: Term 'TABLE' or 'FIGURE' (according to the case) and its priority. Second line: Title corresponding to the chart or table in question. The tables must be explanatory by themselves.
<b>References:</b>	Use APA 6 or 7 format.

## 14. PRESENTATION INSTRUCTIONS - PRESENTING THE PAPER

Here are some general guidelines that may be useful to prepare your presentation:

- Try to be in the venue where the session is going to take place approximately 10 minutes before the start time of the session.
- The format of your presentation should be in **Microsoft PowerPoint** or web-based that is supported by Chrome (**such as Prezi**).
- You can download the presentation from the Internet, but it is better to have it available on a USB stick. The rooms will have a projector and a computer with a current version of Microsoft Office, PDF document reader, browser, and Internet connection enabled. - Online presentations will also be possible. All exact information regarding online presentations will be available to presenters in due time.
- Note that sessions have limited time and are usually assigned more than one presentation.
- Each presentation should last **up to 15 minutes**, followed by a discussion period where the audience and/or the moderator may ask questions.
- We will allow the panelist **5 minutes** to respond.
